Dr. Ramirez congratulated and thanked Mr. Mark Lelonek, cleaner, who is retiring after 14.5 years of service to the district. SPECIAL EDUCATION

COMMENTS ON CONSENSUS

Discussion

- Bus Purchase Bond Resolution Mr. Petrus shared that the resolution was draft by district counsel and needs board approval in order to move forward with borrowing the funds to purchase the school buses.
- Food Service Management Contract Extension for 2024-25 Mr. Petrus stated the contract was bid out two year ago and the contract states the extension increase is linked to the CPI increase which is 3.9%
- Breakfast & Lunch Ala Carte & Entree Prices for 2024-25 Mr. Petrus stated that lunch and breakfast prices are not changing and have not changed for our students in three years. The changes are for ala carte food items only.
- Transportation Contract Extension for 2024-25 Mr. Petrus shared that the contract extension is liked to CPI which is 3.9% and our price per bus will increase just over \$2,700 with Fisher Bus Service. The district currently contracts 14 buses from Fisher.
- Donation from the Jewish Federation to the Middle School Mr. Petrus shared that the Jewish Federation of Greater Buffalo would like to donate \$250 to the middle school social studies department for their work with the Holocaust Resource Center.
- Donation from the Class of 2004 of a Remembrance Tree to the High School Mr. Petrus stated that the OPHS Class of 2004 planted a tree in remembrance of their 10 classmates who have passed away since graduation. The planted tree is a North Easter Redbud and was planted at the High School
- Donation from the American Heart Association & Buffalo Bills to Elementary Schools – Mr. Petrus shared that the donation is for a Hands Only CIP Training Kits for all elementary schools. The value of the donation is \$750.
- Surplus/Obsolete Technology Equipment Mr. Petrus stated the technology items are outdated and no longer used and once declared surplus/obsolete, a company contracted through Erie 1 BOCES will pick up the equipment at no charge to the district.
- Surplus/Obsolete Laptops and Sale of Laptops Mr. Petrus shared that three district employees will purchase the laptops at fair market value.
- Surplus/Obsolete Windom Elementary Music Instruments Mr. Petrus stated the items are in need of repair or are beyond repair and that Windom Elementary would like to declare the instruments surplus/obsolete and then sell or discard them.
- Obsolete Middle School Textbooks Mr. Petrus stated the Middle School is no longer using the books and they will need to be declares obsolete.
- Obsolete South Davis Textbooks Mr. Petrus stated that South Davis is no longer using the books and they will need to be declares obsolete.
- Surplus Middle School Microscopes Mr. Petrus shared the microscopes are beyond repair and will need to be declared surplus.
- Surplus Transportation Equipment Mr. Petrus shared the transportation items are no longer used and will need to be declared surplus.
- Auctions International Surplus Items Bid Award Mr. Petrus stated the bids will be awarded for 39 items and the total award is \$44,176.50
- First Read of Changes to Policy 5661: Wellness Mrs. Hornung reviewed the suggested changes to the policy. The changes come from the Wellness Committee and the wellness tool used to evaluate the policy. The Board also discussed communication around caffeine drinks, which are not offered during the school day but students are bringing them in from home.
- Zero Emission Buses Implementation Timeline Dr. Rogers shared that the resolution is in regards to extending the timeline for districts to meet this mandate. Mr. Petrus reviewed what the district has done so far to meet the requirements from the state for planning for the costly implementation. The Board will review the resolution at their next meeting.

Motion by Mr. Anderson, seconded by Mrs. Sreniawski, to approve the following: **RESOLVED:** That the Board of Education of the Orchard Park Central School District, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, hereby adopts the following resolution:

A BOND RESOLUTION, DATED JULY 30, 2024, OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORCHARD PARK CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, ERIE COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE "DISTRICT"), AUTHORIZING (I) THE PURCHASE OF SCHOOL BUSES (AND RELATED EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES) INCLUDING (A) FOUR (4) SEVENTY-SEVEN (77)-PASSENGER SCHOOL BUSES AT AN ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST OF \$186,000 EACH; AND (B) FOUR (4) THIRTY-THREE (33)-PASSENGER SCHOOL BUSES AT AN ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST OF \$117,000 EACH, AT A TOTAL ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST OF \$1,212,000, ALL FOR USE IN THE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM OF THE DISTRICT, AND (II) THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS OF THE DISTRICT IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,212,000 TO FINANCE SUCH PURCHASE, AND DELEGATING THE POWER TO ISSUE BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE SALE OF SUCH BONDS TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, at the annual school district meeting and vote of the qualified voters of the Orchard Park Central School District, Erie County, New York (the "District") held on May 21, 2024, a proposition (the "Proposition") was duly adopted authorizing the Board of Education of the District (the "Board") to purchase school buses (and related equipment and supplies) at a total estimated maximum cost of \$1,212,000 (or so much thereof as may be necessary, plus an amount necessary for the payment of interest thereon), all for use in the transportation program of the District, and providing for the levy of a tax therefor to be collected in annual installments, with obligations of the District to be issued in anticipation thereof; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize the expenditure for such purchase, and to provide for the financing thereof in accordance with the Proposition;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board (by a favorable vote of at least two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Board), as follows:

SECTION 1. The specific objects or purposes to be financed pursuant to this resolution are the purchase of (a) four (4) seventy-seven (77)-passenger school buses at an estimated maximum cost of \$186,000 each; and (b) four (4) thirty-three (33)-passenger school buses at an estimated maximum cost of \$117,000 each, at a total estimated maximum cost of \$1,212,000, all for use in the transportation program of the district (including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and in connection with the financing thereof).

SECTION 2. The estimated maximum costs of such specific objects or purposes are determined to be (a) \$744,000 for four (4) seventy-seven (77)-passenger school buses; and (b) \$468,000 for four (4) thirty-three (33)-passenger school buses. Such expenditures are hereby authorized. The plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of up to \$1,212,000 of serial bonds or other obligations of the District that may be lawfully issued under the Local Finance Law (the issuance of which is hereby specifically authorized), with such amount to be offset by any federal, state, county and/or local funds received by the District. Unless paid from other sources or charges, the cost is to be paid by the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the District to pay the principal of such bonds or other obligations and the interest thereon as the same will become due and payable.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific objects or purposes is five years, pursuant to subdivision 29 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

SECTION 4. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and of Section 50.00, Sections 56.00 to 60.00, Section 62.00, Section 62.10, Section 63.00, and Section 164.00 of the Local Finance Law, the powers and duties of the Board pertaining or incidental to the sale and issuance of the obligations herein authorized, including but not limited to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and details as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds, and the renewals of such notes, are hereby delegated to the President of the Board, as the chief fiscal officer of the District. Without in any way limiting the scope of the foregoing delegation of powers, the President of the Board, to the extent permitted by Section 58.00(f) of the Local Finance Law, is specifically authorized to accept bids submitted in electronic format for any bonds or notes of the District.

SECTION 5. The temporary use of available funds of the District, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the purpose or purposes described in this resolution.

SECTION 6. This resolution shall constitute the declaration (or reaffirmation) of the District's "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized in this resolution with the proceeds of the bonds, notes or other obligations authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Each of the obligations authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such obligations, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and such obligations shall be general obligations of the District, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the District, without limitation as to rate or amount (subject to certain statutory limitations imposed by Chapter 97 of the 2011 Laws of New York). The faith and credit of the District are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the District by appropriation for (1) the amortization and redemption of any such obligations to mature in such year and (2) the payment of interest on any such obligations to be due and payable in such year.

SECTION 8. The President of the Board is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the obligations authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and may designate the obligations authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" in accordance with Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

SECTION 9. The President of the Board is further authorized to enter into a continuing disclosure agreement with the initial purchaser of the obligations authorized hereunder (or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such obligations), containing provisions that are satisfactory to such purchaser in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, as promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended.

SECTION 10. The President of the Board is further authorized to call in and redeem any outstanding obligations that were authorized hereunder (at such times and in such amounts and maturities as may be deemed appropriate after consultation with District officials and the District's municipal advisor), to approve any related notice of redemption, and to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to effectuate any such calls for redemption pursuant to Section 53.00 of the Local Finance Law, with the understanding that no such call for redemption will be made unless such notice of redemption shall have first been filed with the District Clerk.

SECTION 11. In the absence or unavailability of the President of the Board, the Vice President of the Board is hereby specifically authorized to exercise the powers delegated to the President of the Board in this resolution.

SECTION 12. The District Clerk is hereby authorized and instructed to publish this resolution, or a summary thereof, together with a notice in substantially the form provided by Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law, in the official newspaper(s) of the District, or if no newspaper(s) have been so designated, then in a newspaper having general circulation in the District, which newspaper shall be designated by the Board in a separate resolution. The validity of the obligations authorized hereby, or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such obligations, may be contested only if:

(1) (a) such obligations are authorized for objects or purposes for which the District is not authorized to expend money, or

(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution (or a summary thereof) are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within 20 days after the date of such publication; or

(2) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

SECTION 13. This resolution is effective immediately and shall be placed in the official minutes of the Board as an official action of the Board.
