





community.




Katelyn Welker

Pathway to Presence A Goal for Increased Student Attendance

The Orchard Park Central School District will be partnering with families during the 2023-2024 as we strive to maximize the potential of each student everyday. One of the most important components to achieving this goal is to have students in school, ready to learn, each day. Just missing a few days each month (even in kindergarten) can add up and result in academic and social gaps. Statistically, students that are chronically absent are at a higher risk of dropping out of school, which can directly limit future aspirations. This year we will be launching a proactive approach to assist students and families to overcome attendance barriers by connecting students and families directly with school staff or our Family Solutions Center.

According to Attendance Works, a nonprofit that advocates for policies to improve school attendance, nationally, the percentage of students chronically absent doubled during the pandemic and is higher than ever, at more than 20%. Chronically absent is defined as missing at least 18 days in a school year. Missing direct instructional time can have an impact on academic achievement. As we navigate new "norms", we are recognizing attendance needs and want to partner with families and the community to build resilience and provide support for success.

With this in mind, as a District, it is important for us to understand the attendance barriers facing students and families. Having two-way, pro-active communication is essential to this understanding, which is why this fall families will begin receiving information on how many days your child has missed school. We recognize that student absences can accumulate without us realizing how many have occurred, and are often due to illness or other unexpected circumstances.

If you begin to notice your child struggling with coming to school, please reach out so we can work together. We are excited for our families to join us on the Pathway to Presence and help all of the children of Orchard Park CSD maximize their full potential!

The Virtual Backpack is a place where you can find informational flyers from the school, the PTO, and community organizations that were distributed previously in paper form. They are posted as printable PDFs to afford easy access for parents and will remain posted throughout the school year.

Incident Command Training MM

On August 17, 2023, the Orchard Park CSD administrative team engaged in professional development and training with the Orchard Park's Chief of Police, Chief Fitzgerald. health and safety can be addressed in a highly effective manner. The District appreciates the partnership we have with the Orchard Park Police Department.




Investing In Our Future Educational Facilities Project Updates

The Investing In Our Future Educational Facilities Project was overwhelmingly approved by voters in May of 2022.

We are currently in Phases I and II of the project. Phase I includes the replacement of the athletic turf field at the high school. The Quaker Stadium will be ready for competition by Homecoming weekend. Phase II of the project includes all elementary playground updates. Playground work will be complete

between early September and late October and will include inclusive areas for students and areas for Pre-K students.





The former Eggert playground has been completely removed. All of the new equipment has been installed. The poured in place rubber pathways are in place and the artificial turf surfaces are nearly finished! We can't wait for the Eggert students to test it out as the school year begins!



The existing playground at Windom has been completely removed. Some former pieces of playground equipment are being given to the Town of OP Recreation Department for reinstallation at one of their playgrounds. Windom's playground is built into a hill and this view is from the bottom of the hill looking up towards a large focal point structure near the center of the new playground. Check out this awesome slide which is approximately 18 feet long and follows the contour of the hill.
