# Instructional Leader Council (ILC): Pam Rauh and Chris Popek:

Chris Popek reported:

- OPHS ILC Meeting was October 2, 2023
- Working on curriculum handbook revisions to revise & unify course names
- Previous meeting asked whether a locker bay can be removed to create a classroom, changes to space is delayed because the district is currently preoccupied with multiple significant construction projects
- New radios are expensive cost would need to be worked into the budget, in the interim thinking strategically about radio use in advance should suffice
- 6:00am entrance is available for a few requests. Thus far only a handful of teachers are requesting access.
- Staff Survey discussion is currently focused on the High School building
- Discussion about discipline
- Phys Ed department feels administration visibility has improved. Lines of communication appear open, especially with discipline.
- Tech department is happy, there is an order and clear chain of command •
- Language department concerned because previously there had been a lot of change and new standards.
- Mr. Hafner mentioned the upcoming electives fair for 8th graders will be at the Jan 11th open house for both parents and students. Parents want to be included in the transition to High School

Jeanne Kornowicz reported:

- Tech integration discussion of students leading programs. E.g. Alden HS students make a tech help desk
- Zoë Aylsworth was awarded the STAP-Comm Summer Enrichment scholarship. Her scholarship application was based on her acceptance into the Buffalo Healthcare Exploration two week Program at Roswell Park Cancer Institute.
- New Business
  - 16 old charters approved

## Building Effectiveness Team (BET): Brenda Cimo and Jennifer Duff

Brenda Cimo reported:

- Orchard Park High school BET meeting was October 25, 2023
- **Mentors** New Hires get paired with mentors (seasoned teachers).
  - The mentors go through training.
  - There are monthly staff meetings for new hires.
- Student ID use
  - $\circ$  Students receive their student ID in the first few days of school.
  - It was brought up that students should be using their ID more often (Book check out, lunch, school activities, etc).
  - According to the student handbook, students should be carrying their IDs while on school property.
- Class Rank
  - $\circ~$  OP still has class rank while other WNY schools do not.
  - There is a debate on the future of class rank at OP.
  - All colleges have different admission policies with some colleges clearly stating on their Common Data Set that they view class rank as very important.
  - It was also suggested that, before rank is eliminated, college admissions counselors who view rank as highly important be asked what the impact would be to students if it is eliminated.
  - One suggestion that there be more than one person within each ranking to eliminate the 1/100<sup>th</sup> of a point differences.
  - A survey will be administered to district stakeholders including faculty, students and parents.
