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Dear Parents and Guardians:

On the morning of Thursday, May 9, Windom Elementary School will be conducting a Relocation Drill. The purpose of the drill is to practice our safety procedures in the event we need to evacuate the building and relocate off-site to a safe location. Students should be dressed appropriately for the weather that day - hats, coats, etc. - as we may be outside 10-15 minutes.

The drill, which is being planned in conjunction with the Transportation Department, the Orchard Park Police Department, and the Orchard Park Fire Department, will commence at approximately 9:30 a.m. and should be concluded by 11:00 a.m. During this time, access to the building will be restricted. The relocation site is the Windom Community Church, located on West Abbot Grove, a five-minute walk from our building. All students and staff will walk to Windom Community Church before boarding District buses to return to the school.

In the days leading up to the drill, teachers will discuss the purpose and details of the drill with your child, so that they will be prepared, and any questions can be answered in advance.

There should be no student pick up or drop off at this time. If it is unavoidable, and your child has a scheduled early dismissal or if your child will be arriving late to school during the drill "window," please contact Mr. Dolce via email ([jdolce@opschools.org](mailto:jdolce@opschools.org)) so appropriate arrangements can be made.

Principal: Mr. Johnson – Grades 3-5 ELA testing took place April 2-3 with 2 days of make-ups. The opt-out rate for this year is unknown at this time. Grades 3-5 Math testing will be May 1-2. There will be a relocation drill on Thu. May 9<sup>th</sup> @ 9:30 a.m. when staff and students will walk to the Windom Community Church on W. Abbott Grove. Everyone will be bused back to school to allow Transportation to participate in this drill as well. This allows the school to practice safety procedures in case of a real evacuation. Mr. Johnson and Mr. Bosinski (Buildings & Grounds Dept) is assessing the exact area of the playground in which the new equipment will be installed. An exact install date is not yet determined, but it will be this spring. National Bike to School Day is on Wed., May 8<sup>th</sup>. Kids can walk or bike with their parents to and from school. Bikes can be locked up in the courtyard area.

Teacher: Mrs. Besecker reporting – Mrs. Hutschenreuter is excited to let everyone know that the Boys Run On and Girls on the Run programs are active this spring at Windom. Mrs. Schaffstall thanks everyone for attending McTeacher Night, from which \$900 was raised. The Wellness Committee will be using the earnings for kids scholarships for afterschool programs like Boys Run On for example. There was discussion about renaming the Mother's Day Plant Sale to accommodate different living and personal situations of individuals. There was a motion to change the name of the sale to "Spring Plant Sale" and the motion carried. This takes effect immediately, so the Spring Plant Sale is the same as the Mother's Day Plant Sale. There was discussion about how to convey that a child's early dismissal time (specified in the home to school note) must be adhered to. More specifically, if a parent shows up 15 minutes prior to the time written in the note, the student will not be released until the specified time. There will be a reminder sign at the front desk, as well as a half sheet reminder that will go home.

**PTO Updates**

Niagara Candy Sale (Spring Fundraiser) – The PTO gets a 52.25% discount on the candy orders submitted, therefore we earned about \$6900 from this fundraiser. Candy orders have been distributed to families.

Square 1 Art – Of all the student artwork completed school-wide, there was a 30% product purchase rate amounting to \$6149 worth of products sold. Product will be in on the April 11<sup>th</sup> and the pickup date is being determined either on April 15<sup>th</sup> or 16<sup>th</sup> from 3:30-5:30 p.m. If a parent is comfortable having the merchandise sent home with one of their children, a waiver form may be filled out prior to delivery day.

**Upcoming/Current Events**

Spring Plant Sale – \*Please note event name change from Mother's Day Plant Sale\* It will take place from May 9-10 in Mrs. Lew's gym, with setup on Wednesday, May 8<sup>th</sup>. Due to the relocation drill on the morning of May 9<sup>th</sup>, student shopping will begin at 11 a.m. that day. Up to 3 plants per student can be purchased for \$1 each. Look in MSA for volunteer signup info as we get closer.

Spring Book Fair – Popular kid titles will be communicated to Larry Silver so that they can be well stocked for the shopping event. The book fair coincides with our Ice Cream Social and Art Show. Please sign up in MSA to volunteer.

Ice Cream Social – The chairs are looking at invoices from last year's event to determine how much to order for this year. Many volunteers are needed for this. Please signup in MSA beginning in May.

Hot Dog Lunch – Takes place on June 7<sup>th</sup>. This will be the last year of the lunch. There was discussion about the reason for elimination and it's because it does not comply with lunch requirement standards in school, i.e. a balanced lunch. For this year, we will incorporate fruit, such as watermelon, to make it more balanced. Volunteers are needed to help serve the students.

Spring Assembly – Nickel City Reptiles, on a date TBD, but in early May after state Math testing concludes.

Kevin Dash is the recipient of the PTO Volunteer of the Year Award for 2018-19.

The Windom-Haiti Partnership looks to establish a lunch program at the New Birth School.

This year recently retired Windom teacher, Mrs. Judy Schaner, had the opportunity to visit and teach in our partner school in Belot, Haiti. While there, she taught in the classrooms and met with the teachers and director of the school. When meeting with the teachers, one of the high priority needs they expressed was starting a lunch program for the children. Due to lack of funding, the school has not been able to provide such a program and only a small percentage of the children have the means to bring a lunch. There is much research that points to improved learning when children are nourished. The Windom-Haiti Partnership's goal this year is to help support a lunch program at the New Birth School.

The first fundraiser was held recently. Bracelets with the "Windom Loves Haiti" logo were purchased by Windom students. The next fundraiser is a Haitian Art Raffle that will take place during the Windom Art Show on May 16<sup>th</sup>. Tickets will be available for your chance to win original Haitian paintings.

## Community News - Head Lice

Head lice can be a frequent occurrence, particularly in elementary schools. Head lice is a rapidly growing problem that has no reflection on one's own cleanliness, social or economic situation. Head lice are defined as parasitic insects that can be found on the head and are characterized by itching of the scalp as a result of live lice in the hair or ova (nits) attached to the hair shaft. The adult is a flat wing-less creature with six legs and a stubby antenna. Lice do not hop, jump or fly. The eggs they lay are called nits. The nits attach to the hair shaft and are very difficult to remove as they manufacture their own glue-like substance to hold themselves to the hair shaft. The most common symptom is the persistent itching. Children scratch behind their ears and at the base of their neck. Head lice are not contagious, are not known to spread illness, nor are they life threatening or due to poor hygiene. Rather, head lice are spread through the sharing of hats, combs, brushes or by direct contact with the hair of an infested person. Head lice feet are specially adapted for holding onto human hair. Head lice would have difficulty attaching to smooth or slippery surfaces like plastic, metal, polished synthetic leathers & other similar materials.

If a case is reported in a classroom, all parents in that class will be informed.

### What can you do?

- We ask you to check your child's head, nape of the neck and behind the ears for live lice or nits (lice eggs) on a weekly basis. Do the same for siblings and anyone else in the home. See your physician to confirm any suspicions you may have about what you find.
- Immediately report any confirmed diagnosis found at home to your school nurse.
- Consult with your pharmacist or physician to choose the right product for treatment. Carefully read the directions for application and re-treatment.
- Remind your children not to share personal items such as combs, brushes, hats with one another.
- Check the OPCSD homepage ([www.opschools.org](http://www.opschools.org)), type the word lice in site search for more information.



## Health Office Suggestions

- Fever of 100.4 or higher in the last 24 hours (keep home until fever free for 24 hours without the use of Acetaminophen/ Ibuprofen)
- Vomiting/ Diarrhea in the last 24 hours (keep home for 24 hours after vomiting/ diarrhea)
- Persistent cough
- Loss of sleep that might be due to illness and or coughing
- Runny nose/ cold symptoms (severe congestion)
- Looks sick, complains a lot about feeling sick, is very tired, can't/ won't eat breakfast or get dressed
- Flu symptoms- Fever, chills, body aches, headache, dry cough, nausea and/ or vomiting
- Diagnosis of conjunctivitis or pink eye (should be on antibiotic drops 24 hours prior to return to school)
- Diagnosis of strep throat (should be on antibiotics 24 hours prior to return to school and has returned to his/ her normal activity level)
- Undiagnosed rash
- Unsure? Please call your family Doctor or the Windom Health Office at 209-6322 and as always.... **Please help prevent the spread of illness by practicing and reinforcing proper hand washing technique!**

Dear Parent or Guardian,

New York State Education Law (effective July 1, 2018) requires a physical exam for all students in grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11, as well as students new to the Orchard Park Central School District, and students identified as needing services from Committee for Special Education. This letter will be sent in advance of the upcoming school year when a new physical is required for your child to give you time to schedule/provide the necessary updated physical.

Dear Parents and /or Guardians:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of an important change in the immunization requirements for students entering sixth grade. Effective September 1, 2007 a New York State Public Health Law amendment requires students born on or after January 1, 1994 and those entering the 6th grade on or after September 2007 must receive a Tdap booster immunization. Tdap is the tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis vaccine.

Written documentation of this booster immunization must be provided by your physician's office. Please note that in accordance with New York State Public Health Law/ Education Law your child may be excluded from attending school if immunization requirements are not met.

Please...

- Call your child's doctor with any questions and to schedule an appointment for the Tdap booster
- Forward written documentation to school health office no later than June 15th
- If you are unable to complete immunization requirements by June 15th submit date of scheduled appointment student will receive this booster

It should be noted that school health personnel are not available during the summer months to receive this information. Your prompt attention and cooperation are greatly appreciated. Please do not hesitate to contact your school nurse for questions or concerns.

In order to keep our students with food allergies safe, we ask that you refrain from sending in any homemade treats or items bought from a bakery into classrooms for special occasions. We also ask that you refrain from bringing in any type of food into any common areas of the school other than the cafeteria. We cannot guarantee the safety of these homemade or bakery food items as cross-contamination may pose a risk. If your child is in a "Food Allergy Classroom", you were informed over the summer with a letter from the principal and Health Office. Food allergies can be life-threatening and we are all responsible to keep students safe in schools.

If you would like to send in a treat to the classroom for your child on a **special occasion only**, please make sure that the snack is store bought and pre-packaged from a safe snack list with the proper labeling/ingredient list.

A safe snack list is available for your reference from Mrs. Johnson (School Nurse) and at <http://snacksafely.com/safe-snack-guide/>. Please keep in mind that this is a safe snack list primarily for peanuts/tree nut, dairy, egg and sesame allergies. If your child is in a classroom with any other type of food allergies, please contact your child's teacher or the School Nurse for reference. Always check the label for possible cross-contamination.
