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



Beware of suspicious emails!

Phishing scams are on the rise and scammers are using PTOs to carry them out.

If you receive an email or text that looks like it's coming from a member of the PTO, the PTO Board, or a PTO Chairperson, but it seems suspicious, PLEASE BE CAREFUL. Check the "from" email address or phone number. It may say it is coming from someone within the PTO, but if the actual email address or phone number is not that person's personal contact information, or if it is not from "notify@membershiptoolkit.com", it could be a scam!



Many of these communications appear to be asking the recipient to buy a large number of gift cards, or they may be asking for the recipient to simply respond to the sender. Once a reply is sent, another request will come asking for money or gift cards. Other communications may include a link to click or a website to visit, which could end up being harmful. When in doubt, please check with the person from whom it appears the communication is being sent. It takes just a moment to send a text or an email or to call to confirm whether or not the communication actually came from that person.



Sign up to **VOLUNTEER** and participate in school activities! Many events need only a one-time commitment while others allow you to be involved throughout the year. There are also many things you can do behind the scenes where your teenagers won't see you!! There is still time to select volunteer opportunities that best fit both your interests and time commitment/availability.
