FROM THE DESK OF MR. WOLF:

Welcome to 2020!

As we return from a long holiday break, our focus quickly shifts to the end of the 1st semester and the January exam period. Additionally, we will soon begin preparations for the next school year. Please review the following important information about these two events.

The January exam period scheduled for January 21-24, 2020. While there are no regular classes scheduled for those four days, they are considered attendance days, not vacation days. Exams begin at 7:30 AM, 10 AM, and 12:30 PM. Students are expected to report to the exam location at least 15 minutes prior to their specific examinations. As in the past, transportation will be provided for students for each testing period. Students should expect to be scheduled for a mid-term exam for each of their full-year courses and a final assessment for their semester one courses. All students have been provided with a printed copy of their individual exam schedule and pertinent examination information in homeroom. Additionally, the entire exam schedule is available on the OPHS website. In accordance with the NYS testing regulations, students will not be permitted to bring cell phones into the examination rooms. Students will need to leave their cell phones in their lockers or at home during the exam administrations. A telephone is accessible in each of the House Offices if needed.

As we transition into the second semester, the scheduling process for the 2020-21 school year begins! Students will be provided with a scheduling form during the first day of the second semester on January 27th. Parents and students should begin discussing which courses they will be selecting based on their particular interests and academic goals. The academic handbook (available on the OPHS website) is a very useful and informational tool in helping guide these conversations. Additionally, our counselors and teachers can provide valuable insight and guidance in this process. I encourage you to consult with them in order to make the best choices for your student. I am proud to say that Orchard Park High School is able to offer our students a very diverse and comprehensive selection of courses from which to choose. The course request process is a critical step in developing our staffing and curricular needs for the coming year. Student course requests dictate whether or not a particular course will be offered in the coming academic year.

I am looking forward to an exciting new year filled with the academic, athletic and artistic accomplishments of our talented students! Happy 2020!

OPHS PTO Online Membership Directions

Membership dues for the 2019 - 2020 school year are \$5.00 per family.

We are excited to announce that the PTO will be using Membership Toolkit instead of My School Anywhere for our communications, online store, online membership, volunteer signups and directory. Every family will need to create a Membership Toolkit account to join the PTO (or submit the attached form and an account will be created for you).

As with any new tool, we anticipate some growing pains. If you have **ANY** issues, please contact Natalie Lesh Schaffer at natalielesh2.0@gmail.com or 225-0412.

To create a Membership Toolkit account and join the PTO:

- 1. Go to https://orchardparkhspto.membershiptoolkit.com/ and click the "Register / Log In" button. Click the "Create Account" button on the right side of the page underneath "New User?" Provide your first and last name, email address, create a password and click the "Verify My Email" button
- 2. Go to your email and click the "Verify My Email" button (check your junk or spam folders if you don't receive it immediately). Enter your password where indicated on the verification screen and click the "Create Account" button
- 3. Click on "Step 1: Family Information" and provide the requested information. Click the "Next Step" button. Note: if you indicate that you want the second parent to be able to manage the account, they will receive an email and will have to accept your invitation to do so. They will have to create an account. (You can also invite another parent later.)
- 4. Proceed to "Step 2: Student Information." Click "Add Student" to enter your first HS child's name and grade. Do not enter Classroom Teacher. Click "I have another student" to add additional HS children to your profile. When all HS children have been entered, click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page.
- 5. Proceed to "Step 2: Directory Publish Preferences." You can opt out of having your information published in the online directory. You can also choose which information you would like shared in the directory by unchecking any boxes containing information you wish to keep private. Click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page to save your preferences.
- 6. Once you have created your account and completed your profile, please visit the Store to join the PTO. While you're joining the PTO, you can also make a donation to the PTO General Fund or to Post Prom. For any store purchase, you can pay online through your Paypal account or mail a check or cash to the PTO.
- 7. You can also visit the Volunteer page to sign up for events scheduled in the first half of the school year. The sign up for PTO events later in the school year will be posted at the appropriate time.


