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Dear Grade 3-5 Parents/Guardians:

Your student will be taking the New York State English Language Arts (ELA) Assessment and the New York State Mathematics Assessment shortly. In the event that your child is ill on testing days, there will be an assessment make-up day. If your child will be absent, please remember to call the automated attendance line at 209-6279 (press *) to report the absence.

Previously, each assessment was given over three days for a total of six days of assessment. Like last year, each assessment will be given over two days for a total of four days of assessment for ELA and Math. This is a welcomed change for students and teachers alike.

The schedule is as follows:

English Language Arts Assessment (2 sessions)

Dates: Tuesday, April 2nd & Wednesday, April 3rd

Make-up Dates: Thursday, April 4th – Tuesday, April 9th

Mathematics Assessment (2 sessions)

Dates: Wednesday, May 1st & Thursday, May 2nd Make-up Dates: Friday, May 3rd – Wednesday, May 8th

These assessments will be given during the morning of the designated testing days. Please make every effort to make sure that your child is here on time for the assessments. Unfortunately, we are unable to administer the assessments outside of the make-up windows.

If you have any questions about the assessments, I would be happy to discuss them with you. I encourage you to go to engageNY.org for more information. This web page has a section for parents and guardians that is very helpful. There are also sample questions for the ELA and Mathematics assessments on the website.

In closing, I want to thank you for being so supportive of our mission.

There was brief discussion among the group on the new CCPTO by-laws/guidelines as they pertain to how PTO funds should be spent. Expenses need to benefit the general Windom population as opposed to targeted groups or individuals. PTO account balances should generally be in line with expected recurring or imminent expenses. Therefore going forward, we are minimizing annual fundraisers and keeping only a handful of the top revenue-generators such as the Fun Run and Niagara Candy.

Susan Verde will visit Windom March 12-13. She will meet with every grade and do a yoga session with prize winners from the essay contest. McTeacher Night is on March 13th from 4-7 p.m. at the Orchard Park Rd. McDonald's. Mrs. Biondo thanks the PTO for Henry & Mudge tickets at Kleinhans.

PTO Updates

Niagara Candy Pickup – Candy orders were submitted to Niagara Chocolate. Sales were generally the same as last year (~\$13,000). Candy pickup will be on April 1st from 3-7 p.m in the cafeteria.

Square 1 Art – The stickers and catalogs with ordering information are going home with the students. Please submit your orders to school by March 19th. Spring Book Fair – We will communicate wishlist items to Larry Silver. These will be popular kid titles. Scholastic has contacted our presidents asking us to partner with them for this book fair, however we have no interest in working with them based on issues we've experienced with them in the past.

Upcoming

PTO Co-President Jaclyn Robison mentioned that her son is working on his Eagle Scout project. If there's a project that would benefit the outdoor space at Windom, he would love to consider it as his project. Those present supported the idea. Some suggestions were a pavilion or a nature trail. Will communicate further with Mr. Johnson and any other pertinent staff for consideration.

A Windom parent shared a link on FB about a <u>Project Learning Garden contest</u> sponsored thru Tops Markets. By entering, a school could win a grant to have a community garden installed on school property, which would provide various learning opportunities for students. We will look into this – it' a simple entry form, but will pursue if we think it would worthwhile in the end.

Spring Assembly ideas – Nickel City Reptiles or perhaps Earth Spirit. The proposed time frame for this would be after state testing concludes in early May.

Restaurant Fundraiser – April would be a good time to hold one since it's a relatively quiet month. A sit-down dinner place was suggested, however Christy will look into our options and share.

Orchard Park Central School District's Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program

UPK Registration begins Wednesday, January 2, 2019.

- Children must turn 4 years old by December 1, 2019 in order to be eligible to register for UPK.
- To make an appointment to register your child for the UPK Program, please call Amanda Alba, Central Registrar at 716-209-6325.
- There is limited availability for the UPK program based on grant funding. If more children apply than there are available slots, the district will hold a random selection lottery. This has been the case for the past three years.
- The Orchard Park Central School District partners with local preschool providers for this program. Due to capacity limitations, the program is not housed in our elementary buildings.
- Registration must be completed by Friday, March 29, 2019 in order to be eligible for inclusion in the UPK lottery. The registration forms may be downloaded from the district's website (www.opschools.org/upk) or mailed to you upon request.

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Head lice can be a frequent occurrence, particularly in elementary schools. Head lice is a rapidly growing problem that has no reflection on one's own cleanliness, social or economic situation. Head lice are defined as parasitic insects that can be found on the head and are characterized by itching of the scalp as a result of live lice in the hair or ova (nits) attached to the hair shaft. The adult is a flat wing-less creature with six legs

and a stubby antenna. Lice do not hop, jump or fly. The eggs they lay are called nits. The nits attach to the hair shaft and are very difficult to remove as they manufacture their own glue-like substance to hold themselves to the hair shaft. The most common symptom is the persistent itching. Children scratch behind their ears and at the base of their neck. Head lice are not contagious, are not known to spread illness, nor are they life threatening or due to poor hygiene. Rather, head lice are spread through the sharing of hats, combs, brushes or by direct contact with the hair of an infested person. Head lice feet are specially adapted for holding onto human hair. Head lice would have difficulty attaching to smooth or slippery surfaces like plastic, metal, polished synthetic leathers & other similar materials.

If a case is reported in a classroom, all parents in that class will be informed.

What can you do?

- We ask you to check your child's head, nape of the neck and behind the ears for live lice or nits (lice eggs) on a weekly basis. Do the same for siblings and anyone else in the home. See your physician to confirm any suspicions you may have about what you find.
- Immediately report any confirmed diagnosis found at home to your school nurse.
- Consult with your pharmacist or physician to choose the right product for treatment. Carefully read the directions for application and re-treatment.
- Remind your children not to share personal items such as combs, brushes, hats with one another.
- Check the OPCSD homepage (<u>www.opschools.org</u>), type the word lice in site search for more information.



Health Office Suggestions

- Fever of 100.4 or higher in the last 24 hours (keep home until fever free for 24 hours without the use of Acetaminophen/ Ibuprofen)
- Vomiting/ Diarrhea in the last 24 hours (keep home for 24 hours after vomiting/ diarrhea)
- Persistent cough
- Loss of sleep that might be due to illness and or coughing
- Runny nose/ cold symptoms (severe congestion)
- Looks sick, complains a lot about feeling sick, is very tired, can't/ won't eat breakfast or get dressed
- Flu symptoms- Fever, chills, body aches, headache, dry cough, nausea and/ or vomiting
- Diagnosis of conjunctivitis or pink eye (should be on antibiotic drops 24 hours prior to return to school)
- Diagnosis of strep throat (should be on antibiotics 24 hours prior to return to school and has returned to his/her normal activity level)
- Undiagnosed rash
- Unsure? Please call your family Doctor or the Windom Health Office at 209-6322 and as always.... Please help prevent the spread of illness by practicing and reinforcing proper hand washing technique!

Dear Parent or Guardian,

New York State Education Law (effective July 1, 2018) requires a physical exam for all students in grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11, as well as students new to the Orchard Park Central School District, and students identified as needing services from Committee for Special Education. This letter will be sent in advance of the upcoming school year when a new physical is required for your child to give you time to schedule/provide the necessary updated physical.

Please....

- -Schedule an appointment with your child's doctor for an updated physical
- -Have the physical form filled out by your child's doctor (available on district website or may use form provided by your child's doctor)
- -Return physical form to your child's school Health Office (phone: 209-6322/ fax: 209-6490)

Dear Parents and /or Guardians:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of an important change in the immunization requirements for students entering sixth grade. Effective September 1, 2007 a New York State Public Health Law amendment requires students born on or after January 1, 1994 and those entering the 6th grade on or after September 2007 must receive a Tdap booster immunization. Tdap is the tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis vaccine.

Written documentation of this booster immunization must be provided by your physician's office. Please note that in accordance with New York State Public Health Law/ Education Law your child may be excluded from attending school if immunization requirements are not met.

Please...

- Call your child's doctor with any questions and to schedule an appointment for the Tdap booster
- Forward written documentation to school health office no later than June 15th
- -If you are unable to complete immunization requirements by June 15th submit date of scheduled appointment student will receive this booster

It should be noted that school health personnel are not available during the summer months to receive this information. Your prompt attention and cooperation are greatly appreciated. Please do not hesitate to contact your school nurse for questions or concerns.

Reminder to all parents and guardians of students at Windom re: "Food Allergy Classrooms":

In order to keep our students with food allergies safe, we ask that you refrain from sending in any homemade treats or items bought from a bakery into classrooms for special occasions. We also ask that you refrain from bringing in any type of food into any common areas of the school other than the cafeteria. We cannot guarantee the safety of these homemade or bakery food items as cross-contamination may pose a risk. If your child is in a "Food Allergy Classroom", you were informed over the summer with a letter from the principal and Health Office. Food allergies can be life-threatening and we are all responsible to keep students safe in schools.

If you would like to send in a treat to the classroom for your child on a **special occasion only**, please make sure that the snack is store bought and pre-packaged from a safe snack list with the proper labeling/ingredient list.

A safe snack list is available for your reference from Mrs. Johnson (School Nurse) and at http://snacksafely.com/safe-snack-guide/. Please keep in mind that this is a safe snack list primarily for peanuts/tree nut, dairy, egg and sesame allergies. If your child is in a classroom with any other type of food allergies, please contact your child's teacher or the School Nurse for reference. Always check the label for possible cross-contamination.

If you have any questions, please contact Mrs. Johnson in the Health Office and she can provide you with safe snack ideas.

Thank you for your cooperation in this effort to keep all of our students here at Windom safe, happy, and healthy!
