

March News

From the High School Counseling Department

- Counselors met with all ninth and tenth graders to review/update course requests for next year. Students have until June 1st to make changes to their requests.
- All students in the high school have access to <u>Scoir</u>, an online college and career tool. Your student is able to use Scoir from any computer with internet access once their account is activated. Most students activated their accounts this fall. However, if your child does not have an account and would like one, please have them contact their school counselor. Scoir contains helpful information for all students and will be used throughout high school to assist students with their post-graduation planning.
- The School Counseling Department recently delivered a lesson through English classes to all juniors. The lesson consisted of a review of graduation requirements and an introduction to the college process. As part of the lesson, each student received a maroon folder with useful information specific to what was discussed in the lesson. Please review this information with your student. As a follow-up, we will be meeting individually with each student to go over course selections for their senior year and to discuss their specific post-high school plans in more detail. At that meeting, they will be shown a copy of their transcript listing the courses taken, final grades, and credits from grades 9 through 10. For a detailed breakdown of the college application process, please click <u>HERE</u>.
- The <u>Buffalo National College Fair</u> will take place at the Buffalo Convention Center on March 19th and March 20th. OPHS Juniors will go on a field trip to the fair in the morning on March 19th. Families are encouraged to attend the evening session on March 19th.
- Students and families are invited to join SUNY representatives for an in-person College Fair designed to provide information and answer questions about the college search process and all that is available to undergraduates at The State University of New York. The event will take place at SUNY Brockport from 6 PM to 7:30 PM on Tuesday, April 29, 2025. Register here: https://engage.suny.edu/portal/suny_college_fairs
- Beginning in fall 2025, Canisius will launch the full-tuition <u>Buffalo Promise Scholarship</u>. This award automatically covers 100% of the cost of tuition after any government aid for up to four years of undergraduate education at Canisius for eligible accepted students from the Buffalo area. The student must currently live in Buffalo, defined as a ZIP code beginning with 142. Check out the website for information and eligibility requirements.
- OPHS is a test center for the May 3rd SAT (registration deadline 4/22/25) and June 14th ACT (registration deadline 5/9/25). Please visit the <u>ACT</u> and <u>SAT</u> websites for details and registration information.
- The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is now available for the 2025-2026 academic year. All students attending college in Fall 2025 and their parents need to complete the FAFSA. Click <u>here</u> for more information.
- The NYS TAP application is open for the 2025-2026 academic year. Click here for more information.
- The High School Counseling Department hosts a Google Classroom for each grade level. Ask your child to log in and check out the latest announcements.
