Orchard Park Central School District Foundation Aid Increase Plan

Section 10-d of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021, as amended by §5-b of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2022, requires school districts receiving a foundation aid increase of more than 10% or \$10,000,000 in 2023-24 must create plans on how these funds will be used to address student performance and need. These plans must be completed, submitted to the department, and posted to district websites prior to July 1 of 2023. This is the final year that this requirement is in effect. It should be noted that this requirement does not obligate districts to spend additional foundation aid funds in specific ways, but does require the district to seek public comment and share plans on how they intend to spend these additional funds. Plans are required to cover only the foundation aid increase. The plan does not cover how the district intends to use its entire foundation aid amount.

Please note that the district's foundation aid increase for 2023-24 was included in the district's general fund budget that was approved by voters. Positions and programs were specifically added with the funds. The aid allowed the district to maintain programs, class sizes, and student opportunities without having to raise the \$4.288M through increasing other revenue sources (taxes). NYS has made efforts over the past three years to fully phase in the aid formula. With 2023-24's increase, foundation aid for Orchard Park CSD is finally 100% funded compared to the formula for the first time in seventeen years.

We encourage all stakeholders to review the draft plan and provide feedback at any time. Please also be advised that feedback will be accepted on a continual basis throughout the 2023-24 fiscal year, which is the timeframe of these funding sources.
