



OPHS PTO Membership: Instructions to Join Using Membership Toolkit Online



Membership dues for the 2020 - 2021 school year are just \$5.00 per family.

The PTO will be using Membership Toolkit again for our communications, online store, online membership, volunteer signups and directory,

• If you DO NOT have a Membership Toolkit account from previous years, please follow steps #1 - #11 to create an account and join the PTO.

OR

 If you already have a Membership Toolkit account, please LOG IN and follow steps #7 -#11 below (You may omit steps #1 - # 6)



To create a Membership Toolkit account:

- 1. Go to https://orchardparkhspto.membershiptoolkit.com/
- 2. Click the "Register / Log In" button
- 3. Click the "Create Account" button on the right side of the page underneath "New User?"

4. Provide your first and last name, email address, create a password and click the "Verify My Email" button

5. Go to your email and click the "Verify My Email" button

6. Enter your password where indicated on the verification screen and click the "Create Account" button

<u>To join PTO:</u>

7. Click on "Step 1: Family Information"

- Provide or confirm the requested information.
- Click the "Next Step" button.

Note: if you indicate that you want the second parent to be able to manage the account, they will receive an email and will have to accept your invitation to do so. They will need to create their own account.

8. Proceed to "Student Information"

- Click "Add Student" to enter your first OPHS child's name and grade.
- Do not enter Classroom Teacher.
- If needed, click "I have another student" to add additional OPHS children to your profile.
- When all HS children have been entered, click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page.

9. Click on "Step 2: Directory Publish Preferences"

- You can also choose which information you would like shared in the directory by unchecking any boxes containing information you wish to keep private.
- Click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page to save your preferences.

10. Click on "PTO Membership 2020-2021" under "Store & Data (Information) Forms" to complete your membership.

- Click the "down" arrow to the far right of the "Membership for Families" section and select the number "1"
- If you choose to make an **optional donation to the PTO**, please enter your donation amount in the box to the right of the "Donation of your choosing" under *"General Fund Donation."*
- Click "Add to cart and checkout"
- If you choose to make an **optional donation to Post Prom**, you will have the option to do so on the "Checkout" screen.
 - You will receive a message that states, "Note: You have not completed the following optional forms. You should consider reviewing them before completing your transaction: Post Prom Donation 2020-2021"
 - Click the link that says, "click here." This will take you to a page with multiple donation options
 - If you choose a predetermined amount, select the drop down box under "Qty" and make your selection
 - If you make a donation of your choosing, please scroll to the bottom and enter the amount of your gift next to "Post Prom General Donation."
 - o Click "Add to cart"
 - o Click "Proceed to Checkout"






Post Prom Party


