

OPHS PTO Online Membership Directions

Membership dues for the 2019 - 2020 school year are \$5.00 per family.

We are excited to announce that the PTO will be using Membership Toolkit instead of My School Anywhere for our communications, online store, online membership, volunteer signups and directory. Every family will need to create a Membership Toolkit account to join the PTO (or submit the attached form and an account will be created for you).

As with any new tool, we anticipate some growing pains. If you have **ANY** issues, please contact Natalie Lesh Schaffer at natalielesh2.0@gmail.com or 225-0412.

To create a Membership Toolkit account and join the PTO:

- 1. Go to https://orchardparkhspto.membershiptoolkit.com/ and click the "Register / Log In" button. Click the "Create Account" button on the right side of the page underneath "New User?" Provide your first and last name, email address, create a password and click the "Verify My Email" button
- 2. Go to your email and click the "Verify My Email" button (check your junk or spam folders if you don't receive it immediately). Enter your password where indicated on the verification screen and click the "Create Account" button
- 3. Click on "Step 1: Family Information" and provide the requested information. Click the "Next Step" button. Note: if you indicate that you want the second parent to be able to manage the account, they will receive an email and will have to accept your invitation to do so. They will have to create an account. (You can also invite another parent later.)
- 4. Proceed to "Step 2: Student Information." Click "Add Student" to enter your first HS child's name and grade. Do not enter Classroom Teacher. Click "I have another student" to add additional HS children to your profile. When all HS children have been entered, click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page.
- 5. Proceed to "Step 2: Directory Publish Preferences." You can opt out of having your information published in the online directory. You can also choose which information you would like shared in the directory by unchecking any boxes containing information you wish to keep private. Click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page to save your preferences.
- 6. Once you have created your account and completed your profile, please visit the Store to join the PTO. While you're joining the PTO, you can also make a donation to the PTO General Fund or to Post Prom. For any store purchase, you can pay online through your Paypal account or mail a check or cash to the PTO.
- 7. You can also visit the Volunteer page to sign up for events scheduled in the first half of the school year. The sign up for PTO events later in the school year will be posted at the appropriate time.

Exchange Students at OPHS

Hosting an exchange student is not anything our family had ever thought about but true happenstance brought Arés Comas to our family and to Orchard Park High School. Last February, a usual Saturday morning chairlift ride at the local ski club in Colden, NY for host father, Jamie Hallett, turned into an opportunity of a lifetime for a teenage girl from Spain, a family of four in Colden and we hope an entire school and community. Jamie was riding the lift with a woman he did not know who noticed his ski coach jacket so she mentioned that the exchange agency (with which she is affiliated) was looking for placement for a high school aged student from Spain who is a ski racer. She asked, "Could you please spread the word



around to families you know from the club/race team?" Well we didn't need to spread the word because we said to ourselves: "We ski race, we love new adventures, in fact we were visiting Spain that spring for vacation, *and* we have two OPHS students in our family (Zoe, 9th grade and Ethan 11th)." A family discussion ensued but quickly we all agreed- LET's DO THIS!

In the months that led up to Arés's arrival, there were definitely a few tentative moments and little "fear of the unknown" but as we learned more about our "Spanish daughter" and about the exchange experience in general we grew more and more excited. We shared our news with friends, families, and even some strangers; and not surprisingly many people had stories of a connection to or interaction with an exchange student. It was reassuring to hear many affirmations about the positive benefits that come with hosting or even just befriending a student from abroad. This unique experience, initiated by the student wanting to learn new cultures, habits and ways of living from an American host family, becomes a truly rich and transformative experience for the hosts as well. We are all learning new cultures, habits and traditions and having an "outsider" in the family brings a different and welcomed point-of-view to our household every day. We are also thrilled about now having a global extended family to get to know and share new adventures and journeys with throughout a lifetime. We are already looking forward to a visit to Arés's hometown of Arrós, Spain, in the Val d'Aran region, where her family lives in the Pyrenees with close access to fantastic skiing, mountain biking and many other cultural and adventurous activities. Arés hopes that some OP friends might also visit her in Spain someday.

Compared to her high school back home with about 400 students, OPHS is huge but size is no problem for a new student like Arés who thrives on meeting new people, trying new things and who has many, many interests! She seems to love being here and will tell you that her favorite part OPHS and the Quaker community is..."how everyone makes me feel comfortable; always there if I need them. And...going to all the fun school sponsored events and activities." Having never played soccer, she set her mind to developing the skills to make the team and she just wrapped up her first JV soccer season. When choosing classes, she sought out those that are not options at home and is currently enjoying her Psychology and Elements of Fashion classes most of all. And, the traditions and festivities of "Homecoming Weekend" fell nothing short of spectacular for her, as there is nothing like it at home.

We are grateful to everyone in the OPHS community for welcoming Ares and being a part of her amazing experience. Perhaps some other OP families might also consider this great opportunity!
