OPHS PTO Online Membership Directions

Membership dues for the 2019 - 2020 school year are \$5.00 per family.

We are excited to announce that the PTO will be using Membership Toolkit instead of My School Anywhere for our communications, online store, online membership, volunteer signups and directory. Every family will need to create a Membership Toolkit account to join the PTO (or submit the attached form and an account will be created for you).

As with any new tool, we anticipate some growing pains. If you have **ANY** issues, please contact Natalie Lesh Schaffer at natalielesh2.0@gmail.com or 225-0412.

To create a Membership Toolkit account and join the PTO:

- 1. Go to https://orchardparkhspto.membershiptoolkit.com/ and click the "Register / Log In" button. Click the "Create Account" button on the right side of the page underneath "New User?" Provide your first and last name, email address, create a password and click the "Verify My Email" button
- 2. Go to your email and click the "Verify My Email" button (check your junk or spam folders if you don't receive it immediately). Enter your password where indicated on the verification screen and click the "Create Account" button
- 3. Click on "Step 1: Family Information" and provide the requested information. Click the "Next Step" button. Note: if you indicate that you want the second parent to be able to manage the account, they will receive an email and will have to accept your invitation to do so. They will have to create an account. (You can also invite another parent later.)
- 4. Proceed to "Step 2: Student Information." Click "Add Student" to enter your first HS child's name and grade. Do not enter Classroom Teacher. Click "I have another student" to add additional HS children to your profile. When all HS children have been entered, **click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page**.
- 5. Proceed to "Step 2: Directory Publish Preferences." You can opt out of having your information published in the online directory. You can also choose which information you would like shared in the directory by unchecking any boxes containing information you wish to keep private. Click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page to save your preferences.
- 6. Once you have created your account and completed your profile, please visit the Store to join the PTO. While you're joining the PTO, you can also make a donation to the PTO General Fund or to Post Prom. For any store purchase, you can pay online through your Paypal account or mail a check or cash to the PTO.
- 7. You can also visit the Volunteer page to sign up for events scheduled in the first half of the school year. The sign up for PTO events later in the school year will be posted at the appropriate time.

- Late buses are now running Monday through Thursday they come from the middle school to the high school and the students all go together
- Homecoming week spirit days are this week

STAP-Comm: Natalie (for Michelle Bouton who was not present)

- Charter and nominations of the extension officers and class liaisons were approved
- There was a special presentation on the OP Youth Court given by Nolan Watson and Ava Savarino
- will be starting a monthly history report on STAP-Comm's history
- Old Business: Mr. Bosinski of Buildings and Grounds confirmed to Tom Callahan that the recycling cans are being placed around the high school
- Mr. Wolf announced that there will now be late buses Monday through Thursday
- The Responsibilities Review Board needs a parent representative
- The following charters were approved: Field Hockey, Girls Lacrosse, Girls Swimming and Diving, the Classes of 2021, 2022, and 2023, the Choraleers, Chorus and Drama Club
- The Senior class announced this year's homecoming theme is luau
- There will be a leadership luncheon for STAP-Comm on Nov. 2 at 1:00 pm and the NYSCLSA Leadership Conference is Nov. 24-26 in Lake Placid; each class will nominate an attendee to NYSCLSA and the executive council will go as well
- Tom Callahan: Mr. Hafner was invited to the meeting and was given a small gift to show appreciation for his years of service as an advisor
- Mr. Wolf and Mrs. Rominger thanked Mr. Hafner for his service
- A student from AP Government proposed that single use lunchboxes (ie: paper bags, plastic baggies) be banned this proposal will be taken back to the cabinet for discussion

- ILC Meeting: September 10, 2019
- Minutes from the June meeting were approved.
- Welcomed everyone back. Went around and introduced ourselves and welcomed new parent representative Laura Kelly.
- Approved Consent and Action Agendas
- The first meeting of the year had a very short agenda so an additional item was discussed to get some ideas going forward.
- As always with the first meeting of the new school year we reviewed the SDM procedures.
- Extra-Curricular Eligibility: As per a conversation in June A. Linder began a discussion about students who are pulled from extra- curricular because they are not doing well in their classes. Is there enough help for these students? How do we best handle these situations? Are teachers being put in a bad situation? Are the students taking their situation serious?
