(Doors will open at 7:00, and students will not be admitted after 8:30 p.m.)

*Tickets will be sold online from Thursday, September 21 through Thursday, September 28 ONLY! Students' current OPHS student ID will serve as the ticket.

Orchard Park High School has the pleasure of having one of the most well attended homecoming dances in the area. We are proud of our reputation for providing our students with a happy, healthy, and safe evening that they are sure to remember.

All Orchard Park High School rules as outlined in the *Orchard Park High School 2023 – 2024 Student Agenda and Handbook* apply to the Homecoming Dance.

Please review with your child the enclosed information regarding our expectations for the Homecoming Dance. These expectations are designed to help ensure that our students have another safe and fun-filled evening.

Keeping Kids Safe (KKS) Meeting: In order for students to attend an Orchard Park High School dance, parents/guardians must view the "Keeping Kids Safe" (KKS) video and acknowledge they have done so before their students may purchase a Homecoming ticket. The video is linked on the Parent Portal as "KKS Signoff." The final opportunity to meet this requirement is the last day of ticket sales, Thursday, September 28, 2023.

Tickets

Homecoming dance tickets are to be purchased ONLINE on the Orchard Park Central School District website at https://www.opschools.org/hsdance. Once there, click on the Homecoming Dance link found on the left-hand side of the page. At the time of ticket purchase, students will have to choose which door they would like to enter when they arrive at the dance, either Baker Rd. or Freeman Rd. side. This is done to expedite getting students into the building.

Upon entering the dance, ALL STUDENTS must have their current OPHS Student ID, which will serve as their ticket.

NO ID = NO ENTRANCE TO THE DANCE!

Drop off / Parking

Students, whether driving themselves or being dropped off, should arrive and park on the side for which they purchased their ticket. They may leave the dance through either exit.

Appropriate Dress

Dance attire is **SEMI-FORMAL** and should be in line with the code of conduct as published in the 2023 – 2024 *OPHS Student Agenda and Handbook*.

Attendees should be dressed with the following guidelines in mind:



- A collared shirt, tie (long or bow), dress pants, belt, and dress shoes. (A jacket or sport coat is nice but not necessary.)
- Dresses, dressy pants, skirts, and shoes that are safe and comfortable being worn all night.
- For health and safety reasons, students may not go barefoot at any time.
- Students wearing informal attire, such as shorts, t-shirts, jeans, Crocs (or other foam shoes), or gym shoes will not be allowed entrance.
- Students will be denied entry at the discretion of administration for items that are not expressly mentioned here but that are deemed inappropriate at the time of arrival.

- The High School Counseling department met with the Junior and Senior classes the first week of school for the Fall College Assembly. A plethora of information related to the college planning process including SATs, recommendations, athletics, applications, financial aid, SCOIR, and much more was discussed.
- The Eastman School of Music, in collaboration with The Juilliard School and Ithaca College will
 co-host the Upstate New York Music College Fair on Monday, October 16th. Please visit

- The Western New York Collegiate Consortium of Disability Advocates will be hosting a college night
 for students with disabilities interested in learning about the transition from high school to
 college. The event will take place at Daemen University on October 17th, 2023. Colleges and
 agencies that support this transition across the state will present valuable information. Please visit
 the WNYCCDA website for details and registration information.
- The OP Pride application is due November 1st! Any interested seniors should apply! The application is available on the School Counseling page of the high school website.
- OPHS is a test center for the October ACT, November SAT, May SAT, and June ACT. Please visit the <u>ACT</u> and <u>SAT</u> websites for details and registration information.
- During the months of September and October, the High School Counselors met with seniors for their Senior Check-In to discuss post high school plans. Options including college, trades, military, and employment were discussed.
- The High School Counseling department hosts a Google Classroom for each grade level. Ask your child to login and check out the latest announcements.
- Check out the <u>School Counseling page</u> of the high school website. It includes a variety of resources for students and parents.
- The Scott Krueger Memorial Scholarship application will be available the week of October 9th. Each year, two OPHS seniors are chosen to receive a \$10,000 annual scholarship valued at \$40,000 over four years. Applicants must have a GPA of 90% or above, have 4 credits of math and science, and have participated in at least one season of athletics at OPHS. Additional information and the application are available on the Scholarships-Class of 2024 Google Classroom. All seniors have access to this classroom.

Volunteer to help. As volunteer opportunities become available throughout the year, they will be communicated through PTO emails, on the Facebook page and in the monthly PTO newsletter.

OPHS PTO Membership: Instructions to Join Using Membership Toolkit Online



Membership dues for the 2023 - 2024 school year are just \$5.00 per family.

The PTO will be using Membership Toolkit again for our communications, online store, online membership, volunteer signups and directory,

• If you DO NOT have a Membership Toolkit account from previous years, please follow steps #1 - #11 to create an account and join the PTO.

OR

• If you already have a Membership Toolkit account, please LOG IN and follow steps #7 - #11 below (You may omit steps #1 - #6)





To create a Membership Toolkit account:

- 1. Go to https://orchardparkhspto.membershiptoolkit.com/
- 2. Click the "Register / Log In" button
- 3. Click the "Create Account" button on the right side of the page underneath "New User?"
- 4. Provide your first and last name, email address, create a password and click the "Verify My Email" button
- 5. Go to your email and click the "Verify My Email" button
- 6. Enter your password where indicated on the verification screen and click the "Create Account" button

To join PTO:

- 7. Click on "Step 1: Family Information"
 - Provide or confirm the requested information.
 - Click the "Next Step" button.

Note: if you indicate that you want the second parent to be able to manage the account, they will receive an email and will have to accept your invitation to do so. They will need to create their own account.

- 8. Proceed to "Student Information"
 - Click "Add Student" to enter your first OPHS child's name and grade.
 - Do not enter Classroom Teacher.
 - If needed, click "I have another student" to add additional OPHS children to your profile.
 - When all HS children have been entered, click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page.
- 9. Click on "Step 2: Directory Publish Preferences"
 - You can also choose which information you would like shared in the directory by unchecking any boxes containing information you wish to keep private.
 - Click the "Save" button in the lower right side of the page to save your preferences.
- 10. Click on "PTO Membership 2023-2024" under "Store & Data (Information) Forms" to complete your membership.
 - Click the "down" arrow to the far right of the "Membership for Families" section and select the number "1"
 - If you choose to make an optional donation to the PTO, please enter your donation amount in the box to the right of the "Donation of your choosing" under "General Fund Donation."
 - Click "Add to cart and checkout"
 - If you choose to make an **optional donation to Post Prom**, you will have the option to do so on the "Checkout" screen.
 - You will receive a message that states, "Note: You have not completed the following optional forms. You should consider reviewing them before completing your transaction: Post Prom Donation 2023-2024"
 - Click the link that says, "click here." This will take you to a page with multiple donation options
 - If you choose a predetermined amount, select the drop down box under "Qty" and make your selection
 - If you make a donation of your choosing, please scroll to the bottom and enter the amount of your gift next to "Post Prom General Donation."
 - Click "Add to cart"
 - Click "Proceed to Checkout"
 - For any store purchase, you can pay <u>online through your PayPal account or using a credit</u> or debit card or mail a check or cash to "OPHS PTO, 4040 Baker Road, Orchard Park, NY 14127."
