Regionalization Update

November 26, 2024 memo from Commissioner Rosa:

- Clarification on Monitoring and Amendments:

Section 124-2.5(d) will be revised to note that suggested amendments to regionalization plans will remain advisory rather than mandatory. This ensures that districts maintain full control over the plans they develop.

- Voluntary Participation Acknowledgment

To address concerns about mandatory participation, a new provision (Section 124-2.8) will be added, which allows districts in consultation with their school boards, to elect not to participate in the regionalization planning process by submitting written notification by January 15, 2025.



Rockefeller Institute Recommendations on Foundation Aid

Published on December 2, 2024 (300+ pages)

Recommendations:

- **Data Modernization**

- The replacement of severely outdated data (some from 2000) with current metrics is a significant improvement
- Moving to annually updated data sources like SAIPE for poverty measures will better reflect our current student needs
- The shift to using the Comparable Wage Index for Teachers (CWIFT) instead of the 2006 Regional Cost Index would provide more accurate local cost adjustments

- **Increased Flexibility and Predictability**

- The proposed 3-5-year averages for various metrics would help with budget planning stability
- The recommendation to allow districts to retain up to 10% in reserves (up from 4%) with an approved plan would provide better fiscal management options - *caveat*
- The removal of set-asides in favor of categorical aid would give districts more control over general Foundation Aid

- **Recognition of Current Realities**

- Acknowledgment that schools provide significantly more services than in 2007
- Recognition of mental health needs with specific recommendations for funding
- Understanding of the challenges faced by districts with declining enrollment



Key Concerns with the Recommendations:

- Many recommendations suggest 3-5 year phase-ins, which could delay needed funding adjustments
- The complexity of simultaneous changes to multiple formula components could create operational challenges
- Districts would need significant lead time to adjust budgeting practices
- **Save Harmless Reform Impact**
 - The proposed changes to Save Harmless provisions could significantly impact districts with declining enrollment
 - The requirement to use excess fund balances as offsets against Save Harmless payments could affect fiscal planning
 - The wealth-based reductions could create challenges for districts that have built programs around these funds
- **Enrollment and Demographic Shifts**
 - The report indicates 88% of districts have declining enrollment
 - This could create long-term sustainability challenges for many districts
 - The proposed reforms may not fully address the fixed costs that remain despite enrollment declines
- **Update from Governor Hochul on 12/4/24 -**
 - **“As we craft the upcoming Executive Budget, the Governor believes we should avoid proposals that would negatively impact school budgets, such as eliminating hold-harmless provision...”**

- **School snow-day - December 5, 2024**
 - Last scheduled elementary student day is contingent upon the number of snow days used. Every snow day will add an elementary student attendance day to the end of the school year in June in order to be in compliance with the NYSED 180 day requirement.
 - **Our new last day of attendance Pre-K - grade 5 will now be Friday, June 20, 2025.** Any additional closings will move that date forward.









- Lucia Bowen, goalie, saved 61 shots and had 7 goals against all season




Football

- Awarded the Team Sportsmanship Award for best sportsmanship - voted on by ECIC Division I coaches




Girls Swimming & Diving
